Disclosure of Student Information

Pursuant to the federal No Child Left Behind Act, school districts must disclose to military recruiters and institutions of higher learning, upon request, the names, addresses and telephone numbers of our high school students. However, the district must also notify parents of their rights and the rights of their children to request, in writing, that a district NOT release such information if it is so requested.

Parents or students who are at least 18 years old, wishing to exercise their option to withhold their consent to the release of the above information to military recruiters and institutions of higher learning, must submit a request in writing by Friday, September 19, 2014 to Renee Rudd, CVA Principal, 111 Frederick St., Ilion, NY, 13357.

Cell Phones

Cell phones are not allowed in the school environment. Any cell phone that is on, ringing, out in class, seen or heard will be in violation of the code of conduct. Phones may be stored in lockers, clothing or purses. Phones may be used in the main entrance before and after school. During lunch they can be used in the main entrance, cafeteria, and gym. Consequences for violating the cell phone policy include after school detention, confiscation of phone, and parent notification to pick up the phone after 3:00 p.m.

Food and Drinks in School

A reminder ... No food or drinks (except clear water in a clear container) are allowed in the halls or classrooms. Eating is not allowed in the main entrance or near the Weber Avenue entrance during lunch. All food and drinks should remain in the cafeteria.

After School Academic Help

Teachers will be in their rooms from the end of ninth period to 3:20 pm to assist students with their academics. Please make sure your child, our student, takes advantage of this opportunity to get professional assistance from our faculty. In the course of a year, that would mean your child could receive an extra 75 hours of academic assistance.

Open House - mark your calendar!

Central Valley Academy Open House is scheduled for Wednesday, September 17th at 7 p.m. We will begin in the Main Gymnasium with an introduction of our faculty.

Attendance Procedures

Attendance at school highly contributes to student success and we recommend daily attendance for all of our students. However, we also understand the possibilities of an absence and/or the scheduling of an appointment.

We are most interested in promoting communication between the Central Valley Academy and home. Therefore, please be advised of the following attendance procedures:

- **CALL IN STUDENT ABSENCES:** Parents are asked to call the Attendance Office at 574-3111 or the Nurse's Office at 894-5000 ext. 55911 when their child will be late or will not be attending school. (This system is available to take calls 24 hours a day). In addition, 895-7471 may be used during regular school hours. If a call is not received, an attempt will be made to contact the parents of absent students.
- **APPOINTMENT RELEASE PROCEDURES:** If your child must be excused during the school day, for any reason, please send in an excuse to our school nurse in advance, if possible. This includes appointments during the AM & PM BOCES classes.
- **ILLNESS RELEASE PROCEDURES:** If a student becomes ill, he/she must go to the nurse, and the nurse will contact the parent if this student must be released. At no time should a student leave school without permission, including AM & PM BOCES students. If a student leaves school without permission, disciplinary consequences will be administered.
- **STUDENT SIGN-IN/SIGN-OUT PROCEDURES:** Students MUST bring their excuses and their student passbook to the nurse before first period to be released for all appointments. Students are expected to return to school after all appointments. All students signed out for appointments must sign back in with the school nurse regardless of their time of arrival.

Students arriving late to school must bring excuses stating the reason for tardiness, and **all students must sign in** (regardless of time of arrival) with the school nurse. Failure to sign in/sign out will result in disciplinary consequences.

A Student who does not return from lunch. If a student feels ill before leaving for lunch, he or she is expected to see the nurse before leaving for lunch and follow proper procedures for going home sick. If the student is not returning from lunch for any reason, the students' parent is expected to immediately call the school and provide the reason, and follow up with a note. If a student is not able to get a hold of a parent immediately during lunch, they are expected to come back to school or call school themselves before the end of the lunch period and then have his/her parent follow up with the complete absence procedure of calling the school and sending a note. Failure to follow the procedures will result in discipline. **If the school does not receive the proper call and documentation, the student will be considered truant and disciplined accordingly.**

- **EXCUSES:** Written excuses are required for all tardiness, appointments, and absences in addition to telephone contact with parents/guardians. Excuses must accompany the student on the day of his/her return to school. In addition, if a student is absent from school for five (5) consecutive days or more, a doctor's certificate is necessary.

Excuses should include the following information:

- ◆ Student's full legal name
- ◆ First period (homeroom) teacher's name
- ◆ Date(s) of absence(s)
- ◆ Time of release and whether the student will be returning
- ◆ Reason for absence
- ◆ Physician's/Dentist's name
- ◆ Signature of Parent/Guardian

PLEASE NOTE: Students who are absent or suspended from school may not attend extracurricular activities or functions on the day of the absence as a spectator or participant. This includes interscholastic athletics (practices and games), field trips, dances, concerts, club meetings, etc.

Attendance Policy - concerning course credit

Based on a normal bell schedule, high school students will be denied credit when:

- ◆ There are 28 absences for a full year course
- ◆ There are 14 absences for a half year course

Students who are absent from class due to a school sponsored activity are to arrange with their teachers to make up any work missed in a timely manner as determined by the student's teacher.

Visitors to the School

We welcome visitors to Central Valley Academy. If you wish to talk to a teacher and want an appointment, please contact the teacher directly. If this is not possible, please contact the Guidance Office or the Main Office, and we will set up the appointment.

If you are in the building during the school day between 7:30 am and 3:30 pm, while students are present, we ask that you follow Board of Education Policy and sign in at the Main Entrance in order to get a visitor's tag. Please return the tag after your visitor meeting.

Committee on Special Education (CSE) visitors: The CSE office is now located on the bottom floor of the building. Visitors will park on Weber Avenue and enter the building at the designated door.

Parking

Faculty and Staff Parking: Office staff will park by the circle and the area between the building and the cemetery. Faculty will park behind the building.

Student Parking: The only student parking is along the wall by the athletic field and in the lower lot by the Frederick St. Bridge. Students must register their cars with the main office. The registration meeting will be Friday, September 7th at 3:00 P.M.

Visitor Parking: Visitor Parking spots are located across from the circle by the main entrance and just beyond the parking area between the building and the cemetery. Committee on Special Education visitor parking is located on Weber Ave.

Arrival and Dismissal

When dropping off and picking up students:

- Please do not use the Weber Ave. location for drop off; it is strictly for school buses.
- Drop off and pick up students on Frederick St. in the area by the bleachers marked "Student Pick Up".
- Please do not block the circle in front of the main entrance. Your assistance is appreciated.

Sports Practices

Sports practices will begin promptly after the 2:50 p.m. dismissal. If students need extra help, they are encouraged to stay with teachers until 3:20. Coaches will expect their arrival soon after. Your child will be expected to sign up in their teacher's classroom if they plan on staying that day after school. By doing so, coaches will be aware to expect the student(s) and will make arrangements for someone else to cover their practice until 3:20. This policy will allow students to get after school help without missing an excessive amount of practice. This will also allow students to get home at a more reasonable time to allow for homework.

Student Photos in Media Publications

From time to time, student photos, video, audio, information (name, grade level, teacher, school, honor roll, awards, art work, etc.) are released for use in district publications, on the district's website, in the media and on district-sanctioned social media websites to depict Central Valley School District activities. If you do not wish your child's image or information used for these purposes, you must notify the school in writing to: *Ms. Renee Rudd, Principal, Central Valley Academy, 111 Frederick St, Ilion, NY 13357.*

Grade 9-12 Lunches

Students in grades 11 and 12 will have lunch fifth period and will be able to leave campus. Students are expected to return prior to the passing bell at the end of the period to allow time to arrive in their sixth period class on time.

Students in grades 11 and 12 enrolled in a Herkimer BOCES program will be having lunch at CVA.

Students in 12th grade that attend BOCES will have lunch 6th period when they return to CVA. They will be able to leave campus, but it is absolutely necessary to return on time.

Students in grade 10 will eat at the beginning of sixth period while grade nine students are in the gym. Halfway through the period students will switch.

Lockers

Your locker number and combination will be printed on your schedule. Please keep this confidential! Students should memorize their locker combination and not disclose it to anyone, including friends.

Remember that lockers are the property of the school. Designated school personnel have the right to search a student's locker. Only school locks may be placed on student hall lockers. Students are expected to maintain their lockers in good order. The school assumes no responsibility for student losses. No one may change a locker without permission from the principal.

Transportation to BOCES

The following is taken from the BOCES student handbook (with permission):

“Students are provided with bus transportation between their home school and the Career Tech Center. If a student has a valid reason to drive or ride in a vehicle to the Center he/she should contact the Center Main Office and the Home School Main Office to obtain the necessary permission. Students who drive without this permission or carry unauthorized passengers will be subject to disciplinary action. Parking is limited, therefore, driving is only permitted in extreme cases.”

In order to drive or ride a student must first obtain a permission slip from the Career Tech Center with Mrs. Fox's, BOCES Principal, signature. Students must then bring the slip to Ms. Rudd, Central Valley Academy Principal and get her signature. Only then may a student drive or ride to BOCES. No student will be allowed to miss class to be a client for a BOCES program such as Cosmetology, etc. We provide two buses for each run to and from BOCES; that allows for plenty of room for our students. Buses will pick up students at the Weber Avenue Entrance.

College Now Information and Registration Sessions—now free!

Herkimer County Community College's (HCCC) concurrent enrollment program, College Now, allows high school students to earn HCCC college credit by taking college courses through HCCC's College Now program. College Now courses are taught by high school instructors at the high school, during the regular school day and is free for CVA students. By taking more rigorous courses in high school, students learn early about the workload and expectations of college. The Dignity for All Students Act

New York State's Dignity for All Students Act (the Dignity Act) seeks to provide the State's public elementary and secondary school students with a safe and supportive environment free from discrimination, intimidation, taunting, harassment, and bullying on school property, a school bus and/or at a school function.

The Dignity Act was signed into law on September 13, 2010 and took effect on July 1, 2012.

This legislation amended State Education Law by creating a new Article 2—Dignity for All Students. The Dignity Act also amended Section 801-a of New York State Education Law regarding instruction in civility, citizenship, and character education by expanding the concepts of tolerance, respect for others and dignity to include: an awareness and sensitivity in the relations of people, including but not limited to, **different races, weights, national origins, ethnic groups, religions, religious practices, mental or physical abilities, sexual orientations, gender identity, and sexes**. The Dignity Act further amended Section 2801 of the Education Law by requiring Boards of Education to include language addressing The Dignity Act in the codes of conduct. Additionally, under the Dignity Act, schools will be responsible for collecting and reporting data regarding material and incidents of discrimination and harassment.

You should feel safe and able to do your best anytime you are at school. Everyone is different, and no one should feel harassed or threatened because of race, color, weight, national origin (where your family comes from), ethnic group, religion, religious practices, disability, sexual orientation, gender, or sex. Whether you are on school property, on the telephone, or at home on your computer, it is against the law for anyone to use words or actions that make you feel threatened or unsafe in school. And it is against the law for you to do the same to anyone else. The Dignity for All Students Act protects you and helps everyone feel safe and ready to learn at school.

Code of Conduct – We have included an abbreviated Code of Conduct in this newsletter. A complete copy is published in the Student Planner and one planner will be distributed to each student. Code of Conduct

The intent of the Code of Conduct is to promote responsible behavior that creates an orderly and safe school environment. It is the belief of the Central Valley School District that everyone in our community must strive toward contributing to this goal. The objective is to develop a moral school community based on:

- Responsible Behavior Use self control in your actions and language
- Mutual respect Treat yourself and others with care and consideration
- Concern for Others..... Be truthful, honest and fair in your dealings with others
- Cooperation..... Listen and work together to make a positive contribution
- Personal Excellence Put forth your best effort in whatever you attempt

Student Behavior – All teachers are to be on the alert for any student behavior which is in violation of school regulations. Students should behave in a manner that will be a credit to our school.

The privilege of participating in and attending extra-curricular activities will depend on school behavior and daily attendance. The privilege may be removed after a parent conference and written notification to a student.

Each member of the school community is expected to be responsible for his/her own behavior. The rules of conduct focus on personal safety and respect for the rights and property of others and apply in the classrooms and throughout the school system and at all school related activities on or off school property.

Library Hours

The library will be open 8 am to 4 pm daily to accommodate students that want to study, work on research papers, homework, or need access to a computer. A late bus will be available for students that need transportation home at 4 pm.

Student Dress Code

As we start a new school year, we need to be reminded of our student dress code. Based on court cases and appeals to the Commissioner of Education, a school may establish rules for dress. The Student Dress Code will be enforced in a consistent and fair manner. We have a dress code that has been adopted is stated in the Central Valley Academy Student Code of Conduct and is explained below.

ACCEPTABLE AND APPROPRIATE:

All members of the school community are expected to dress in a manner that is appropriate and acceptable, and is not disruptive to the learning and teaching environment. All students are also expected to give proper attention to personal cleanliness. A student's dress, grooming and appearance, including hair style/color, jewelry, make-up and nails, shall:

- Be safe, appropriate and not disrupt or interfere with the educational process.
- Recognize that extremely brief garments and see-through garments are not appropriate.
- Ensure that underwear is completely covered by the outer clothing.
- Include footwear at all times. Footwear that is a safety hazard will not be allowed.
- Not include the wearing of hats in the classroom except for a medical or religious purpose.
- Not include items that are vulgar, obscene, libelous or denigrate others on account of race, color, religion, creed, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, or disability.
- Not promote and/or endorse the use of alcohol, tobacco or illegal drugs and/or encourage other illegal or violent activities, or depict weapons.

UNACCEPTABLE AND INAPPROPRIATE:

- Excessively short shorts and skirts (must fall below fingertips when arms are resting at side)
- Tube tops, net tops, halter-tops, spaghetti straps, see-through clothing, and plunging necklines (front or back), A-shirts, or any tank top whose straps are not at least 3 fingers wide
- Bare midriffs (any shirt will need to meet the waistline if the arms are held straight out)
- Exposed underwear
- Any item that by word or picture is vulgar, obscene, and libelous, or offensive to others on account of race, color, religion, creed, national origin, gender, sexual preferences, and/or disability
- Promotes or endorses the use of alcohol, tobacco, or illegal drugs and /or encourages other illegal or violent activities
- Extreme hair styles/color, jewelry, make-up, and nails
- Coats are not to be worn in the classroom or in the halls during the school day. Temperatures can vary in the building, so students should be prepared with sweatshirts or sweaters to wear when it is cold outside.
- Pajamas
- **Reminder on wearing of hats:** Hats are not to be worn in the building and should come off when you enter the building and placed in your backpack/locker, not to be carried from class to class.

DRESS CODE VIOLATIONS

Students who violate the dress code shall be required to modify their appearance by covering or removing the offending item and, if necessary or practical, replacing it with an acceptable item. Any student who refuses to do so shall be subject to discipline, up to and including in-school suspension for the day. Any student who repeatedly fails to comply with the dress code shall be subject to further discipline, up to and including out of school suspension.

Bookstore

Central Valley Academy announces the opening of the Student Bookstore! Students can purchase school supplies such as notebooks, pens, pencils as well as CVA apparel such as t-shirts, sweatshirts, umbrellas, string bags and other accessories.

Weber Ave Usage

When dropping off or picking up your child, use the main entrance by the football field accessed from Frederick St. Weber Ave is for buses only and vehicles are not allowed in the circle from 7:30-8 am and 2:30-3:30 pm. With the increase in buses transporting students, it is extremely important you follow this policy. Your cooperation is appreciated.
